FRICK ART RESEARCH LIBRARY FELLOWSHIP APPLICATION 2025-2026

Fellowship information

Two fellowship opportunities are available at the Frick Art Research Library working with the web archiving team for the New York Art Resources Consortium (NYARC). Fellows will contribute to a unique web archive collection devoted to born-digital resources for art history, including websites for New York City galleries, museums, artists' websites, catalogues raisonnés, and auction catalogs. The fellows will evaluate candidate sites for web archiving; be trained in using Archive-It, Conifer, and Webrecorder tools to capture websites; create bibliographic records for websites using OCLC Connexion; perform review, maintenance and QA of archived websites; participate in discussions regarding web archiving policy and workflow for the Frick and NYARC; and assist with beta testing of new tools and research. Fellows will additionally have the opportunity to present at local and national professional events, contribute to NYARC blog posts, and become actively involved with the international web archiving community.

The fellowship recipient will commit to working remotely for 8 hours/week (120 hours/semester for the fall 2025 and spring 2026 semesters; 30 weeks total from September 2025-May 2026), with occasional onsite meetings. This fellowship includes a scholarship in the amount of \$7,965 that will be divided equally between the fall 2025 and spring 2026 semesters. Fellows must register for INFO 667 Art Librarianship and take either INFO 698 Practicum/Seminar or present their fellowship project at #infoshow2026 in spring 2026. If the fellowship recipient has previously taken INFO 667 Art Librarianship, this requirement can be substituted with another art librarianship/special collections/archives course subject to the approval of the Dean of the School of Information. The successful applicant must take at least 6 credits in both the fall 2025 and spring 2026 semesters.

Please note that continuing the fellowship through spring 2026 is contingent upon review of the fall 2025 semester by Frick Art Research Library staff.

The fellowship recipient will be selected by Frick Art Research Library staff following an initial review by Pratt-SI staff. Official notification will be made in late April 2025.

Eligibility

To be eligible for consideration, an applicant must have:

- started the MSLIS program no later than spring 2025
- a graduation date of June 1, 2026 or later
